2-3 volunteers to alternate reciting the triads (helpful if at least one has the actual chaplet)

One volunteer to lead the *Memorare*

The Miraculous Responsory

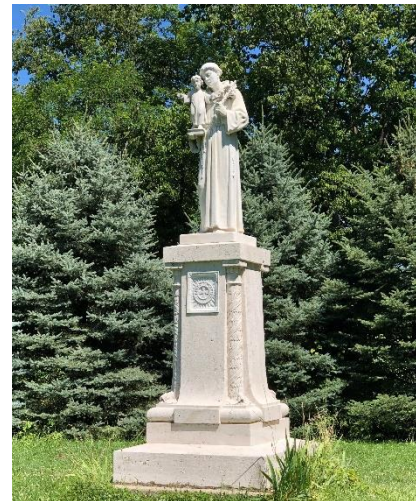
If, then, thou seekest miracles,
